values. Like the cognitive domain, the affective domain has hierarchal categories. As a learner moves up in the categories, they become more involved, committed and self-reliant. In the lower levels, learners are considered externally motivated and in the higher ones they are internally motivated.

The information in this table begins with the lowest level of affective learning and ends with the highest level (Bloomsburg, 2011).
